Proverbs 10:4 NIV

Lazy hands make for poverty, but diligent hands bring wealth.

Proverbs 12:24 NIV

Diligent hands will rule, but laziness ends in forced labor.

2 Thessalonians 3:10-12 NIV

For even when we were with you, we gave you this rule: "The one who is unwilling to work shall not eat." We hear that some among you are idle and disruptive. They are not busy; they are busybodies. Such people we command and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to settle down and earn the food they eat.

1 Timothy 6:17 NIV

Abraham's faith required him to make a DECISION.

Genesis 22:2-4 NIV

Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love—Isaac—and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you." Early the next morning Abraham got up and loaded his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance.

Abraham wasn't being IMPULSIVE in making his decision

2 Corinthians 9:7 NIV

Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Proverbs 3:9 NIV

Honor the LORD with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops.

Third, Abraham based his decision on a specific PROMISE.

Genesis 22:5 NIV

He said to his servants, "Stay here with the donkey while I and the boy go over there. We will worship and then we will come back to you."

Hebrews 11:17-19 NIV

By faith Abraham, when God tested him, offered Isaac as a sacrifice. He who had embraced the

promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son, even though God had said to him, “It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned.” Abraham reasoned that God could even raise the dead, and so in a manner of speaking he did receive Isaac back from death.

1. God promised him this boy + 2. God promised that “It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned” + 3. God couldn’t lie = 4. Therefore even if Isaac died up there on the mountain top, God would raise him from the dead.

*Proverbs 3:9-10 NLT Honor the LORD with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce.
10 Then He will fill your barns with grain, and your vats will overflow with good wine.*

Abraham’s decision increased his faith and gave him a powerful testimony for God.

Genesis 22:12-14 NIV_“Don’t lay a hand on the boy!” the angel said. “Do not hurt him in any way, for now I know that you truly fear God. You have not withheld from me even your son, your only son.”¹³ Then Abraham looked up and saw a ram caught by its horns in a thicket. So he took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering in place of his son.¹⁴ Abraham named the place Yahweh-Yireh (which means “the LORD will provide”). To this day, people still use that name as a proverb: “On the mountain of the LORD it will be provided.”
